3. English Test Taken Within the Last 2 Years:

- If you have taken an English language proficiency test within the last two years and achieved the required score for admission to the Sloan Master's in Leadership and Strategy program, you may not need to retake the test.
- We recognize the following assessments: Duolingo, IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge CPE, CAE, or PTE Academic scores. An IELTS score of 6.5, which is the equivalent to CEFR level B2 is acceptable.
- If you are required to take a test, we would encourage you to take the Duolingo English Test, which is completely online and allows you to receive results within 48 hours.

4. Lived and Worked in a UKVI Approved English-Speaking Country for More Than 2 Years:

- Individuals who recently have lived and worked in a UKVI-approved English-speaking country for more than two years may also be exempt from taking an English language test.
- Ensure that you have documentation or evidence to support your residency and employment history in the English-speaking country for the specified duration.

5. Degree with English Language Instruction Evidence:

- If you hold a degree where the language of instruction was English, you may qualify for an exemption from taking an English language test.
- Gather official documentation, such as transcripts or certificates, that clearly indicate the language of instruction was English.
