

Late applications to the Part-time Masters in Finance programme commencing in August 2025

Formal application deadlines for the Part-time Masters in Finance August 2025 intake have now passed. However, we are accepting late applications on a case-by-case basis. We are looking for the most talented candidates to join our exceptional MiF class. We recognise that sometimes opportunities for study come at unexpected times, so we ensure that we provide opportunities for off-schedule consideration.

If you wish to be considered for a late application, you must email your request to <u>mif@london.edu</u>, titled Late Application Request (MiF Part-time), with the below information:

- One-page CV
- Your nationality and country of residence (please note, for the Part-time programme, you must be based in the UK, or within a reasonable commutable distance to London if based in Europe)
- Short paragraph detailing your post-MiF aspirations
- Your degree transcripts (if you wish to be considered for a GMAT/GRE waiver)

We will then be in contact to approve or decline your request for a late application. Please note: late applications are not automatically permitted, and as stated above, they are considered on a case-by-case basis by the Admissions Committee.

If you wish to submit a late application, and are approved to do so by the Recruitment & Admissions Team, you should satisfy <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- You must be available for a week of full-time, in-person attendance for the first week of the programme (11 August 2025 to 15 August 2025)
- If we make you an offer, you must be prepared to make initial fee payments (totaling GBP 10,000) shortly after the offer.
- If you require a student visa to study in the UK (for example, you do not have UK or Irish nationality and would be travelling from outside the UK to attend the MiF), you will require a CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) for the <u>Student visa</u> application. For more information on visa requirements please visit <u>our website</u>. To receive your visa on time, you will need to act quickly.

Please note that you will need to have your funding in place, as scholarships are rarely available at this point of the admissions cycle.

If you are a really strong candidate, you have as good a chance of admission as earlier applicants.

It is imperative that you act quickly if you wish to submit a late application. You need to be ready and committed to start the MiF Part-time programme this year. We will not be allowing deferrals for late applicants.

Applications for the August 2026 intake will open in August 2025. We expect the application deadlines to be similar to the 24/25 year and the essays to be unchanged.
