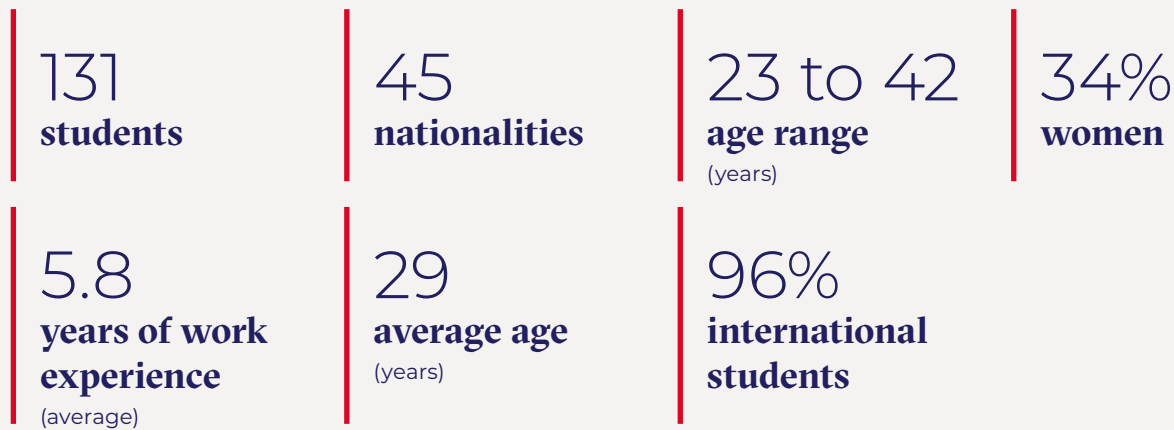

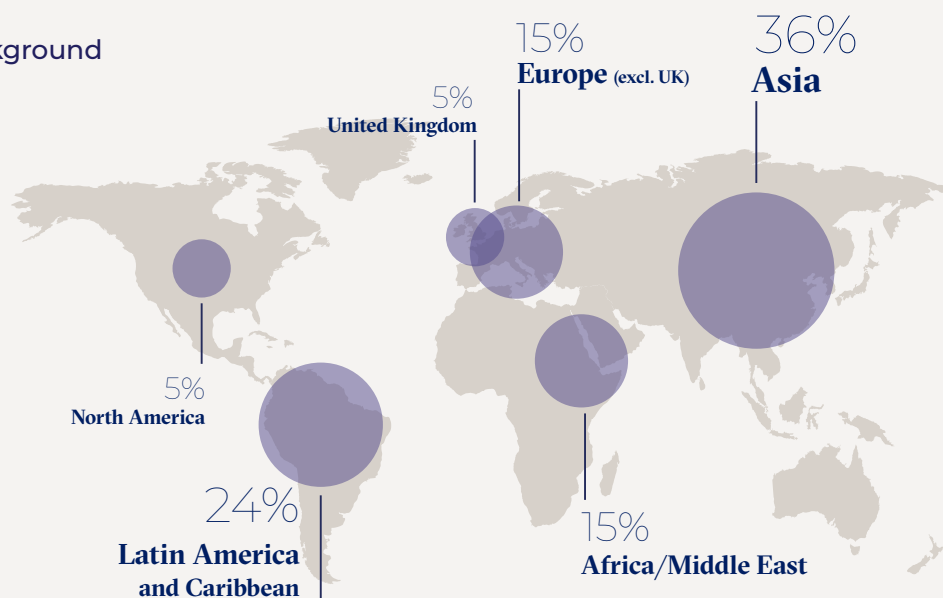

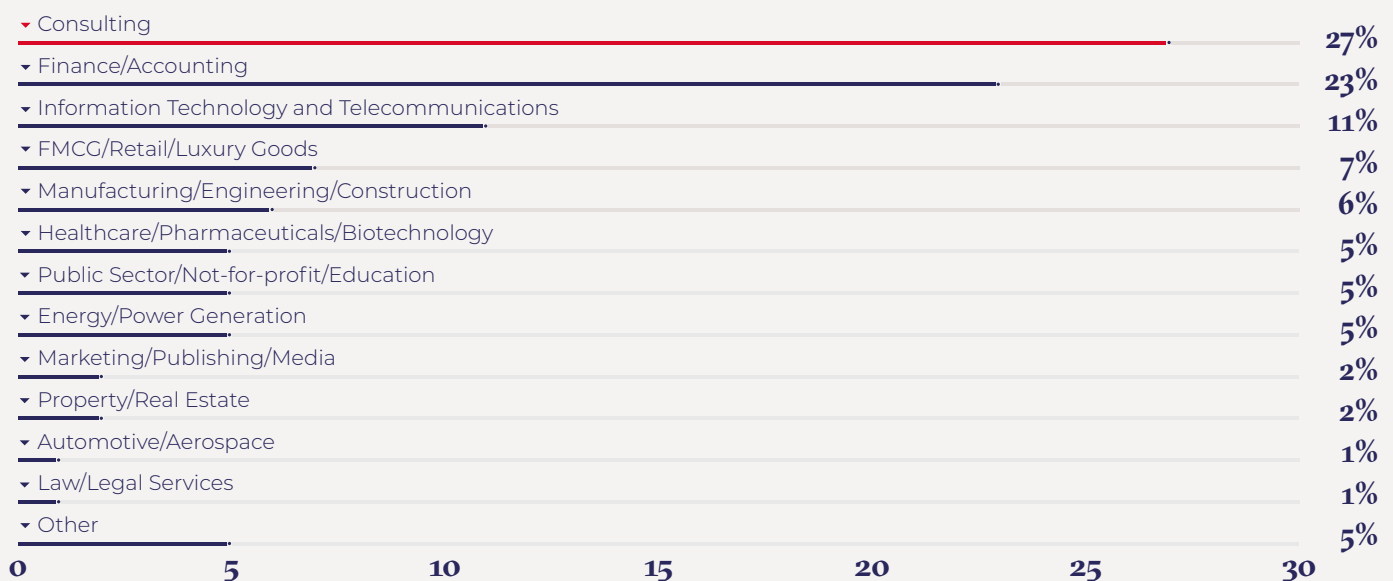
MiFFT2022 graduating class profile



Regional background



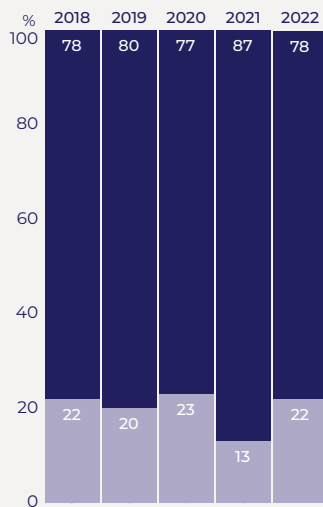

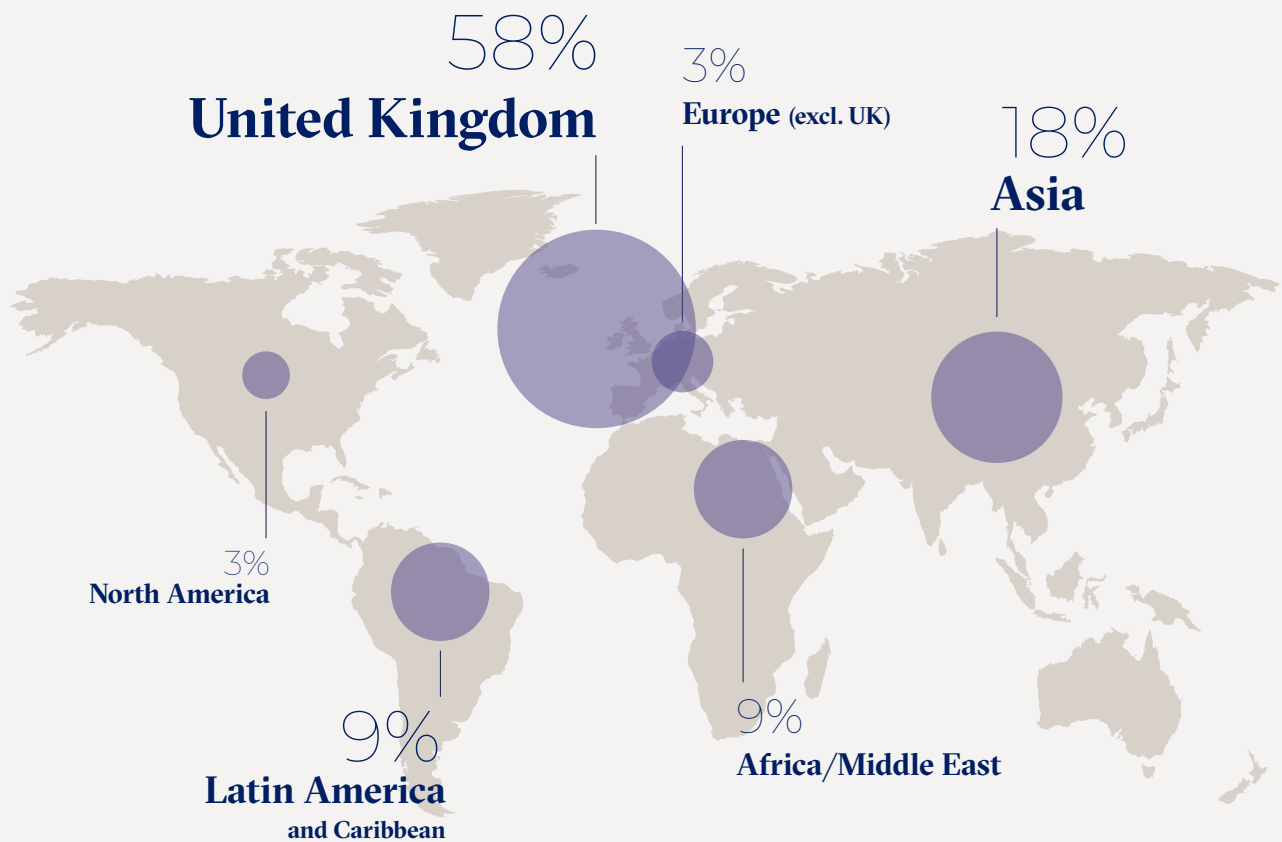

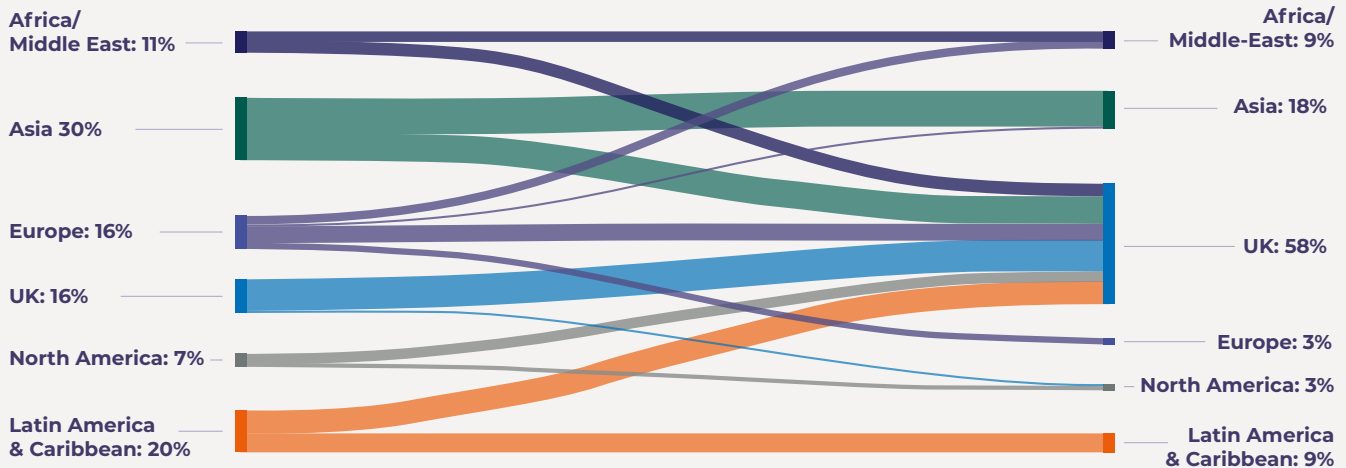

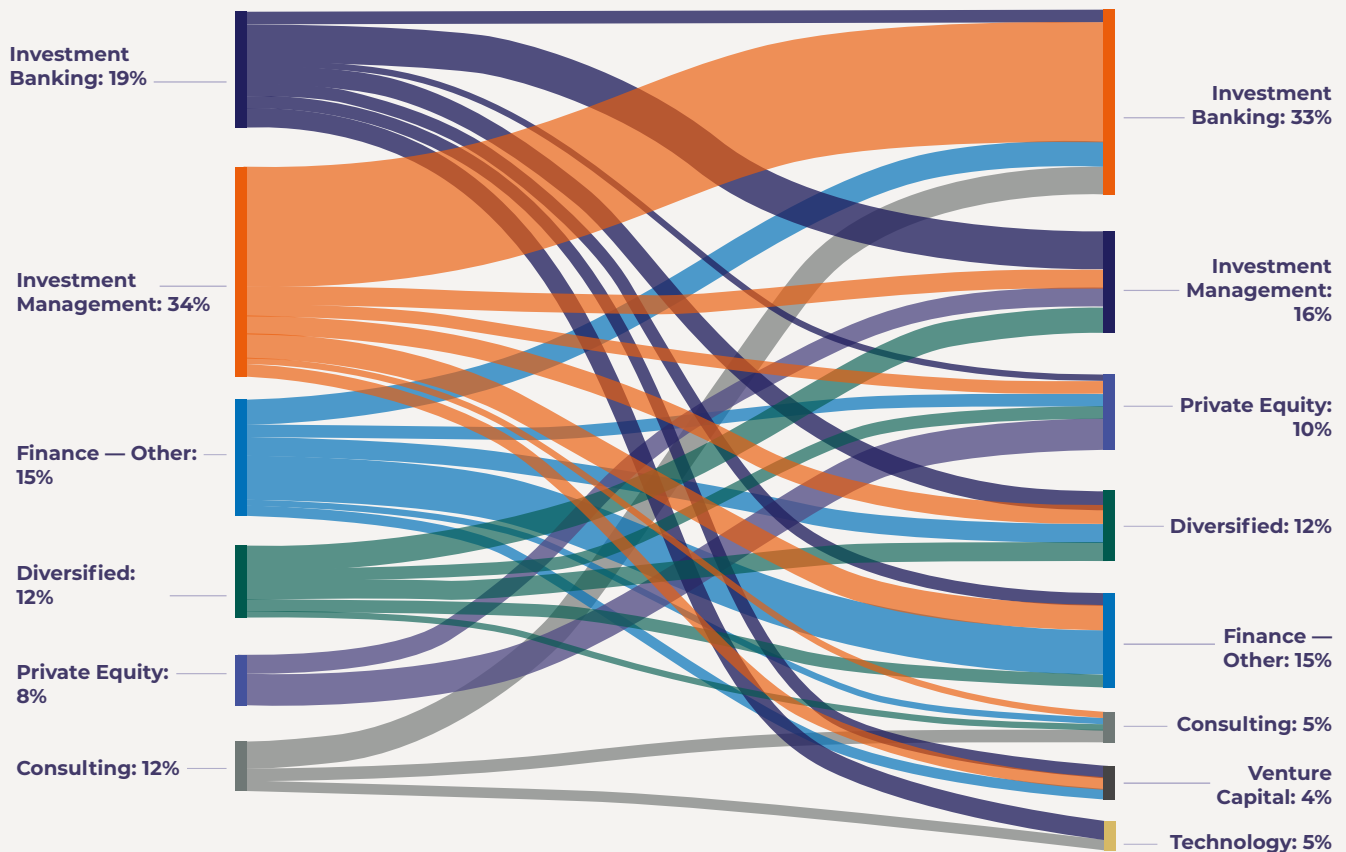
